

### TYLER MCKENZIE EVANS

WRITER/DIRECTOR

During his childhood, to escape the mundanity of the suburbs in Mississauga, he would go to the theatres weekly, which is where he discovered his love for storytelling. Tyler's first short film Teething (2019) was accepted into 2019's Reelworld Film Festival. He wrote, directed, produced and edited the film. He has completed his second short film, I Live Here, which he has received funding from Ontario Arts Council, NFB and CBC. It had its world premiere at Aspen Shortfest 2022 and it will be streaming on CBC Gem in November 2022. Tyler's main goal is to create original stories centred around Black people and people of colour. He is currently writing his first feature film.

### MALACHI ELLIS

PRODUCER

Malachi Ellis is a Black Gay Producer based in Toronto. He is an alumnus of TMU's Media Production & OYA Media Group's Emerging Filmmakers.

Post academics, Malachi has focused on telling diverse and authentic stories that challenge the status quo and amplify BIPOC and LGBTQIA+ voices. He recently produced the series teaser for Streams Flow from a River (dir. Christopher Yip) and the dramatic short I Live Here (dir. Tyler Evans), which premiered at the Oscar-qualifying Aspen Shortsfest 2022 and on CBC Gem Fall 2022. He is currently working on two Blackled proof of concept horrors; Diaspora (dir. Tyler Evans) & The Fly That Doesn't Listen Follows The Corpse Into The Grave (dir. Lu Asfaha).

In 2021, Malachi participated in Kidscreen's The Next Wave: Diverse Voices program, where he received mentorship from Creative exec Cort Lane. He was also named one of Playback Magazine's 10 to Watch for 2021.

As a Black gay man, Malachi feels a responsibility to produce fictional content that inspires others and pushes for authentic representation. He always seeks to foster professional relationships with other LGBT+ & BIPOC creatives.

### LINDSAY BLAIR GOELDNER

PRODUCER


Lindsay is a film producer and karaoke enthusiast based in Toronto. Her credits include There's No Place Like This Place, Anyplace (Hot Docs, CBC), Learn to Swim (TIFF), Streams Flow From a River (CBC), Death Valley (Fantasia, Tallahassee) and Salmon Pink (Popcorn Frights, FilmQuest) among others.

She began producing branded video content in New York City before producing commercials in Toronto for clients such as Google, McDonald's and General Mills. After completing the Producer Lab program at the Canadian Film Centre in 2019, she teamed up with fellow Producer Lab alumni Shant Joshi to join Fae Pictures as the Director of Production. She is currently lead producing and providing production oversight to several projects including a drag queen coming-of-age story Queen Tut (dir. Reem Morsi), feature-length art documentary The Archivist (dir. Tricia Hagoriles), two episodic dramedies I Know A Place (dir. Tricia Hagoriles) and Degrees of Separation (dir. Eva Grant), short horror film Diaspora (dir. Tyler Evans), trans-led dramatic short Scaring Women at Night and is preparing to distribute narrative coming-of-age feature I Like Movies (dir. Chandler Levack). In her spare time, she recommends films on TikTok.

## SHANT JOSHI

Shant Joshi is a queer Indo-Canadian producer based in Los Angeles and Toronto. His credits include the films Framing Agnes (Sundance, NEXT Audience Award, NEXT Innovator Award), International Dawn Chorus Day (Berlin, TEDDY Award Winner), Porcupine Lake (Toronto), and Noor & Layla (BlackStar); the hit web series Teenagers (CSAs); and the Dekkoo original series, I'm Fine (Outfest). Shant co-founded the Future of Film Showcase as a launchpad for emerging Canadian filmmakers, and he previously worked at the United Talent Agency, Buchwald, and Lit Entertainment Group (fka Madhouse Entertainment). He is an alum of the Producers Lab at the Canadian Film Centre, holds a Certificate in Entertainment Law from Osgoode Hall Law School, and was named to York University's inaugural Top 30 Changemakers under 30.

Shant is currently Vice-Chair on the Board of Directors at BIPOC TV & Film, a sitting member of the Restructuring, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (REDI) Action Committee at the Canadian Media Producers Association, and sits on the Advisory Board at the Future of Film Showcase.





### CARA RICKETTS

**EXECUTIVE PRODUCER** 

Ms. Ricketts recently had a heavily recurring role is 20th Century Fox's The Resident. Cara is best known for her dynamic portrayal of "Lilly Rue" in CBC's Street Legal and was also highly acclaimed for her role as "Mary" in the CBC/Netflix series Anne with an E, winning the ACTRA Award for this performance. Her guest stars include Global's Departure, CityTV's Hudson and Rex WB's DC series Titans, BBC America's Emmy Award winning series Orphan Black, as well as NBC's Law & Order: SVU, CTV's Saving Hope, CBC's Murdoch Mysteries and El's mini-series Book of Negroes. Her feature film credits include Stanleyville, Jean of the Joneses, Across the Line, and The Anniversary.

Cara has also developed quite a fan base for her two leading roles in the Ubisoft games - the villainess "Mickey" in Far Cry New Dawn and "Sayla" in Far Cry Primal.

In theatre Cara has performed extensively in both Canada and the US including several seasons as a leading lady at Canada's esteemed Stratford Festival, the leading role of "Isabella" in Measure for Measure for Theatre for a New Audience in New York, and most recently Time and the Conways on Broadway. Ms Ricketts other selected credits include "Queenie" in The Wild Party (Acting UpStage) for which she was nominated for a Dora Award for Outstanding Performance, "Hedda" in Hedda Gabler (Necessary Angel), "Marianne" in Constellations and "Susan" in Race (Canadian Stage), opposite Jason Priestly

Her latest interested in Web 3 and she is advising a few projects including a project in the Flim3 space.



## DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

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Many low-income neighbourhoods in Toronto have slowly been changing: overpriced grocery stores, coffee shops, and condos are popping up. People of colour that live in these areas eventually disappear along with the area they once knew. Melina, the protagonist, is our watcher; she notices little changes in her neighbourhood. As an audience members, we start to question if what she's noticing is really happening or if it's just her own paranoia. DIASPORA is dark and twisted in so many ways, and I'm extremely excited to have my world premiere at TIFF, a city that's been so close to my heart throughout my life.
