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




SHORT SYNOPSIS

Odd things begin to happen to Olive and Benny in their isolated home. As their memories and belongings begin to disappear, their home is transformed into a liminal space. There are hints of another life replacing theirs; glimpses of a little girl, perplexing fridge magnets, and a mysterious woman. They piece together that this is a different life for Olive and realize a heartbreaking fact - this new life doesn't include Benny.

LONG SYNOPSIS

The film begins with our leads, Olive and Benny, in an isolated home in rural New Brunswick. Olive frantically looking for something she's lost, and Benny calmly working away in his workshop. Eventually they come together and we learn it's their anniversary and we see their dynamic as a couple. Olive is outgoing and sarcastic, while Benny is reserved and serious. They eventually go for a walk and come to a lake, where Benny has perplexing visions of a little girl. An approaching storm snaps them back to reality and they head home only to find a mysterious wooden wagon in the middle of their living room.

This evolves into memories not adding up, or being erased, and rooms being completely different, as Olive and Benny find that their home is transforming into this liminal space. And while Olive is shifting into this other life, Benny is slowly, kind of, fading away. There is a cosmic event happening that's messing with both their physical space and their minds as they try to figure out what's going on.

All of this is told in a non-linear way; We spend a lot of time on the day Olive and Benny met, which consequently is also the day Olive almost meets Ada. This moment is where the timelines split off from one another.

At the climax of the film, this new timeline with Ada has all but taken over and Benny sees how much this other life, a life with a daughter, means to Olive and comes to terms with that. They say their "I love you's" and they "break up" as Olive chooses the life with Ada and their daughter. Which culminates with her interacting with Ada at the wedding and not Benny. So Benny disappears and this new reality completely takes over, Benny is erased from Olive's life and memory since in this reality they never actually meet.


The film ends with Olive going to a woodworking shop, looking for a present for her daughter's birthday. There she meets Benny, and they don't recognize each other as he sells her a beautifully handcrafted wagon. Just as she's about to leave they both have this faint air of recognition. And just as Olive is about to say something, we cut to black.

ARIANNA MARTINEZ WRITER / DIRECTOR (SHE/HER)



Olive is a playfully brazen individual who lives in a quiet and remote home with her partner Benny. She is a confident woman but uses humour to deflect when the going gets tough.




IAN OTTIS GOFF Actor (He/Him)

WHAT WAS THE INSPIRATION FOR THE FILM?




HOW LONG DID THE PROJECT TAKE?

WHAT WAS YOUR FAVOURITE PART OF PRODUCTION?


Asking the impossible of the crew, but working with them to realize the visual world of the film.
